

SCHOOL DIARY

FIRST DAY AT THE SCHOOL

The new session 2025-26 will commence on Tuesday 1st April 2025 at 7.15 am. All students are expected to report five minutes before the first bell at 7.15 am.

School timing in summer months: April 1st to May 17th. 7.15 am to 01.15 pm.

SUMMER BREAK FROM 18TH MAY TO 22ND JUNE 2025 SCHOOL REOPENS ON 23RD JUNE FOR REGULAR CLASSES.

On the first day of the school, children are warmly greeted and welcomed at the assembly with 'Tilak' by their teachers. As usual, this day involves acquainting students with school's operations and premises. They will be shown their section, introduction of class teacher, subject teachers, activity teachers and all other students along with the distribution of class timetable. Full attendance is expected on the first day. Class rooms are adorned, teachers will welcome all the new-comers with beautifully crafted crowns in the foundational classes. The well planned first day sets the tone for the academic year, featuring efficient execution and enjoyable activities in the class and outside providing students an opportunity to interact with their peers and teachers.

The Academic year is divided into two semesters for grades 1 to 8: April to September and Oct. to March.

Months of Assessments

1. April to May – Periodic Test- 1 in July

2. July to September – Term 1 assessment in Sep.

3. Oct to December - Periodic Test - 2 in Dec.

4. January to March - Term – 2 Assessment in March

Students' performance will be assessed continuously throughout the session with the help of class test on OMR sheet conducted weekly. Various scholastic, co-scholastic activities, assignments and subject enrichment activities done throughout the year will be the base for the internal mark allotment.

School Fees will be collected in four instalments on mentioned dates in the school calendar. Parents are requested to adhere to the due dates mentioned below:

April 1^{st} to 20^{th} - 1^{st} Instalment

July 1^{st} to 20^{th} - 2^{nd} Instalment

Oct. 1^{st} to 20^{th} - 3^{rd} Instalment

Jan. 1^{st} to 20^{th} - 4^{th} Instalment

- Fees is to be deposited at the designated ICICI branch only. No cash transaction at the school counter for fees.
- Delayed payments will entitle fine @ Rs. 50/- per day.
- Write the full name of the student with the Scholar Number at the back of the cheque/DD if paying by the same.
- A penalty of Rs. 1,000/- will be imposed in case of cheque bounce or if the cheque is dishonoured by the bank.
- To avail school bus facility, Bus fee has to be deposited by 4 cheques at the beginning of the session before 15th April. They are to be dated 15th April, 15th July, 15th Oct. and 15th Jan.

ARTICLES PROHIBITED ON CAMPUS

Parents kindly refrain from sending the students to school with ornaments or fancy bags, water bottles and tiffin boxes. Avoid metal scales or sharp tools or knives. We encourage children to bring simple tiffin box or pouch to help minimise pointless play and damage.

Students, parents and visitors are prohibited from carrying fireworks or any other dangerous articles or inflammable articles to school.

Students are not to bring money to school unless asked by the educators.

Students are not allowed to carry mobiles, i-pods, cameras, GPS trackers, e-smokers or any dangerous weapons to school.

Parents are restricted from intake of smoke, gutka, chewing gum or any such items in the school premises.

Parents are expected to keep their mobiles on silent mode when they enter the school campus.

St. Anselm Our Patron Saint

St. Anselm came from a noble Lombard family and was born in Aosta in the Italian Alps. St. Anselm's mother was a good and pious Burgundian woman, but after her death, his father's violence and harshness finally caused Anselm to flee to France. After several years of wandering, St. Anselm took the Benedictine habit in 1060 at Bec (Normandy), where his illustrious countryman Bl. Lanfrance had started a famous school and soon St. Anselm was outstanding for his learning. Within three years, he was made Prior and after another 15 years, despite his reluctance, Abbot.

As Abbot, St. Anselm had to cross over to England from time to time in connection with his Abbey's English properties, and there he became known and was highly esteemed for his virtues and fearless zeal. So much so that in 1099 he was made Archbishop of Canterbury in the hope that he would be able to cope with the encroachments of King William, the Red.

Many important writings of this gentle Prelate, who was considered the greatest

intellectual of the age and a "pattern for all theologians", were composed during his two banishments. They earned St. Anselm the title of "Father of Scholasticism" and "Doctor of the Universal Church" (1720) on account of the deep and lasting influence which his thinking has had upon philosophy and theology.

When the French Capuchin Fathers came to Ajmer, they found St. Anselm as the most appropriate saint to be the patron of their new school. They adopted the Saint's motto for the school "DEO AMABILES ET HOMINIBUS" which means, "Be loveable to God and to man". St. Anselm's Pink City School, Jaipur hopes to make all students always pleasing to God and fellow men.
